- ALLURE-(GIGANTEA EXTRACTION)(P-2-6). 1961. Distributed 1965
- ATTRACTION-(An Edna Sponcer seedling.) 1958 (F-4-1). Distributed in 1960's
- BERKELEY-(An E. gigantea extraction of 1961. Given Dick Wright who named it and propagated it after 1963
- CRENATED BEAUTY-(A'Doncella' Seedling of 1965).DONC LLA(P-1-16) was an E.gigantea extraction of 1960 with reddish crenate margin on leaves, All of this strain tends to have doubly crenate margins and very thick leaves
- CRINKLES (Of E. gigantea extraction) 1954. Was used by Frank Reinelt crossed with

 E. shaviana to got a pretty seedling of medium size and curly margins (Wholehand)
- CURIN LOCKS-(An E. palmeri Hort. seedling selected for its curly leaves and relatively small size. Related to Hardy# 2 used by Dick Wright to produce Meridian
- CYNTHIA-(Gigantea extraction)
- DON:ELLA-(P-1-18) (Gigantea extraction)1960, Cronated margin carried to seedlings, such as Crenated Beauty and several others as yet unnamed
- DOROTHY of E.palmeri Hort. extraction several years before Edna Spencer was originated and prior to 1940 a few years. Curly Locks came later
- EDNA SPENCER (Found among a group of seedoimgs of Echeveria nalmeri Hort. extraction prior to 1940. Was named after Edna Spencer of Alameda (now deceased) and was distributed prior to 1957. Was sold by Johnson's in 18 1966 several years after its first distribution and grown by Dick Wright
- EMBOSSED GEM A seedling of Edna Spencer with high caruncile being grown by Dick Wrigh Grown in 1958.
- FRILLY MAID (E. palmeri Hort. extraction) 1958. Offsets freely. Named for its frilly leaf margins.
- HARRY BUTTERFIELD. (A Gigantea extraction with red, crenate margin) 1960. Head tends to divide so is not hard to increase slowly. This seedling was selected and named at the suggestion of ir. Jay Dodson of ISI. Only recently introduced.
- LOVELINESS (E. palmeri Hort extraction and related to Frilly Maid and others. Was
 Grown about 1958 and distributed to friends. Some like Curly Locks but a larger
 plant.
- MARJORIE POGUE Seedling of E. gigantea extration grown in 1952 and widely used for later seedlings with perhaps well over 50% good seedlings with wavy red margin, has at times formed a small caruncle as did Harry Butterfield in more recent youngest for sale by Dick right in 1965. Named after youngest married daughter of Hall-B.
- MARY BUTTERFIELD (A hand pollinated seedling of PEQUITA crossed with ELIZABETH SAYLOR Grown in 1954. Named after late wife in her honor. Pequita was a light green seedling of Gigantea extraction and with a very curly leaf margin. ELIZABETH SAYLOR was used as the pollen parent to furnish the pinkish copper color and the wavy margin came from the other parent. Was being offered for sale by Dick Wright in 1965.
- MANY DIANE (A SAEDLING OF GIGANTEA extraction with fine wavy red margin, once grown in the U.C. Botanical Garden and now grown in a limit ed way by Dick Wright) The pisitors at the Botanical Garden were enthusiastic about this cultivar was named after a granddaughter

NORTHERN LIGHTS - (one of the gigantea strain with wavy red margin) Grown in 1958

PURPLE BEAUTY - (Seedling of Gigantea extration with somewhat way margins and with an attractive purplish shading when grown in the full sun. Propagates easily.

REGALIS - Seedling of Cigantea extraction and with a very attractive color. The plant was given to Dick Wright who named it. Has a ruddy color and twisted or folded leaves. Mrs. Lila Lilylof San Rafael has a start of this promising cultivar.

Several other seedlings may be introduced under name in due time.
