

Echeveria 'Pulvi-Carr' Walther.

Parentage: *E. carnicolor* × *E. pulvinata*.

Stem short, but evident, to 4cm tall or more; leaves many, crowded oblong-ob lanceolate to 7cm long, 2cm broad and 8mm thick, slightly upcurved and shallowly concave above, rounded beneath, covered in dense fine hair, they are bright green flushed russet or deep red at the tips.
Flowers. The inflorescence is an equilateral raceme with 25 to 30 peach red and Salmon-orange flowers. Flowers Dec - January on.

Origin. Deliberate cross made by Victor Reiter Jr in 1933, first described and recorded in the American Journal Vol VI 1935 N° 8.

Remarks. This hybrid comes near *E. pulvinata*, differing in its paler flowers, narrower leaves and shorter stem making for an altogether more compact plant. The influence of *E. carnicolor* appears to be only slight.
